1. Approval of Minutes

Minutes of the September 7, 2012 meeting were approved with one minor correction.

2. Strategic Action Agenda 2012-13

President Glotzbach referred members to the draft Strategic Action Agenda that was distributed with the meeting materials. Members expressed appreciation for the revisions made to the prior draft. IPPC members expressed their unanimous endorsement of the draft Strategic Action Agenda 2012-13.

3. Update from SGA

SGA president Matt Walsh read the Mission Statement that has been adopted by the SGA Senate for this year. The slogan, "Make It Happen," reflects the intention to be proactive in dealing with student issues and desires. The SGA representatives on IPPC will provide
