2. Admissions and Financial Aid Update

Vice President for Admissions and Financiad Mary Lou Batesdistributed and reviewed the current admissions and financial aid overview reporte noted that decisions were sent out on Wednesday(3/22/17) and Admissionsvelcomed a second group of high school juniors today. As previously reported, the College received cond number of applications this year of just over 10,000, which is up from just under 9,200 last.year reported that this year the class size was 71,4with 37 students in London. For next year are looking at a smaller class size of 658, with 25 inLondon.

Mary Loualso reported that the College has seen a 32% increase in early decision (ED) applications, which means that 50% of the **clags**inwill be admitted ED While this trend is great, it also represents an increase in financial aid requests.
